PERSONAL CARE ITEMS: Bath-size bars of soap; lightweight, dark-colored towels; toothbrushes; sturdy combs; and metal nail clippers.

FABRIC KITS: 2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester) **and** 2 spools (250-300 yards each) of matching or neutral-colored general purpose thread. Each fabric piece should be one of these sizes (based on fabric width): 2 ¹/₄ yards of 60" wide fabric, 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, <u>or</u> 4 yards of 36" wide fabric.
